THESE MATTERS came on regularly before the Marine Employees' Commission (MEC) on August 7, 2000, when the Inlandboatmen's Union of the Pacific (IBU) filed three unfair labor practice complaints against the Washington State Ferries (WSF). IBU's complaints charged WSF with engaging in unfair labor practices within the meaning of RCW 47.64.130 by interfering with, restraining or coercing employees in exercise of rights; and refusing to bargain collectively with representatives of employees.
