THIS MATTER came before the Marine Employees' Commission for consideration of the motion to dismiss MEC Case No. 11-90 filed on November 6, 1990 by the Inlandboatmen's Union of the Pacific.

On August 9, 1990, the Inlandboatmen's Union filed a complaint charging the Washington State Ferries with unfair labor practices. A discussion of the complaint was held by the MEC on August 24, 1990, at which time the Commission determined that the facts alleged, if true and provable, would constitute an unfair labor practice. Chairman Dan E. Boyd was appointed Hearing Examiner in the case. A prehearing conference was scheduled for November 2, 1990, and a November 14, 1990 hearing date set. The Washington State Ferries filed a timely Answer to the complaint on October 19, 1990.

Prior to the commencement of the November 2, 1990 prehearing conference, the parties informed the Hearing Examiner that they had reached a mutually agreeable settlement of the matter. As a result of that settlement, by letter dated November 6, 1990, Attorney John

Burns withdrew the unfair labor practice complaint filed by the IBU.

Pursuant to the withdrawal of the unfair labor practice complaint by the Inlandboatmen's Union of the Pacific (WAC 316-45-090), it is hereby ordered that MEC Case No. 11-90 is dismissed.
