THIS MATTER came on regularly before the Marine Employees' Commission (MEC) on October 2, 2006 when the Inlandboatmen's Union of the Pacific (IBU) filed a request for grievance arbitration, MEC Case 3-07, on behalf of Barry Porter. The IBU alleged that Washington State Ferries (WSF) terminated Mr. Porter without just cause.

Chairman John Swanson was assigned to serve as Mediator for the settlement conference scheduled on October 19, 2006. Commissioner Elizabeth Ford was designated to act as Arbitrator and a hearing scheduled for January 12, 2007.

The parties were unable to resolve the matter during the October 19 settlement conference. By letter on January 9, 2007, IBU Business Agent Margaret Pelland withdrew the request for grievance arbitration.

ORDER

It is hereby ordered that the request for grievance arbitration, filed by the IBU and docketed as MEC Case No. 3-07, is closed in acknowledgement of the union's withdrawal.
