THIS MATTER came on regularly before the Marine Employees' Commission for consideration of the Inlandboatmen's Union of the Pacific's Motion to Dismiss.

On October 17, 1986, IBU filed a complaint with MEC alleging that WSF committed unfair labor practices in regards to the manning of the M/V Express. On December 16, 1986 IBU again submitted a charge alleging unfair labor practices over the compensation of the deck department personnel on the M/V Express. This matter came on for hearing before the Marine Employees' Commission on January 7, 1987. IBU was represented by John Burns, attorney at law, and Washington State Ferries was represented by Robert McIntosh, Assistant Attorney General. IBU and WSF mutually agreed to a settlement at the hearing. A letter of withdrawal of both unfair labor practice charges was filed with the Commission on January 30, 1987. The Commission, having reviewed the files and records herein, and being fully advised in the premises, now enters the following:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered, that the unfair labor practice charges of the Inlandboatmen's Union of the Pacific filed on October 17 and December 16, 1986 against Washington State Ferries are hereby dismissed.
